New York, November 10, 2009 — Now in its 22<sup>nd</sup> year, **The Art Show**, organized by the Art Dealers Association of America (ADAA) to benefit Henry Street Settlement, is America's longest running national fine art fair. In March 2010, **The Art Show** continues the ADAA's commitment to curatorial expertise and diversity, bringing compelling exhibitions of art ranging from cutting-edge, 21<sup>st</sup> century works, to museum-quality pieces from the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

Expanding the range and excellence of **The Art Show**, ADAA welcomes nine first-time exhibiting galleries: Blum & Poe, Los Angeles; Marianne Boesky Gallery, New York; Valerie Carberry Gallery, Chicago; Jeffrey Deitch, Inc., New York; Howard Greenberg Gallery, New York; Nicole Klagsbrun Gallery, New York; Michael Kohn Gallery, Los Angeles; Menconi & Schoelkopf Fine Art, LLC, New York; and Pace/MacGill Gallery, New York.

The 22<sup>nd</sup> edition of the fair carries on ADAA's tradition of bringing dealers with the highest quality artworks and dedication to professional excellence to one location. ADAA President Lucy Mitchell-Innes notes, "The longevity and success of **The Art Show** is testament to ADAA members' expert knowledge and commitment to curatorial excellence." According to Linda Blumberg, Executive Director of ADAA, "Art collectors appreciate **The Art Show** because the intimate atmosphere and consistently high level of works present an ideal opportunity to interact with our expert dealers and purchase works."

The 2010 **Art Show** will include 21 exceptional solo and two-person focused exhibitions, including shows of new work from **William Kentridge** at Marian Goodman Gallery and **Charles Long** at Tanya Bonakdar Gallery. PaceWildenstein will present works by **Robert Rauschenberg**, and Luhring Augustine will present a show of works on paper by **Albert Oehlen**. **Alighiero e Boetti** will be the focus of the solo show at Sperone Westwater, and James Cohan Gallery will present *Second Nature*, a solo exhibition of **Roxy Paine**. Galerie Lelong will present a solo booth of **Nancy Spero**, and a show of self-portraits by **Martin Kippenberger** will be a highlight at David Nolan Gallery. Dealers are also organizing outstanding group and thematic shows such as Cheim & Read's *Important Works by Women Artists: Ghada Amer, Louise Bourgeois, Jenny Holzer, and Joan Mitchell*, and *Three Generations of Conceptual Artists* at Barbara Krakow Gallery.

Daily admission to **The Art Show** from March 3<sup>rd</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup>, and its Gala Preview on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2010, will benefit Henry Street Settlement, one of New York City's best-known and most effective social services and arts agencies.

**The Art Show** 2010 will be held from Wednesday March 3, through Sunday, March 7, at the Park Avenue Armory at 67th Street New York City. Admission is \$20 per day. The show hours are as follows: Wednesday through Saturday, noon to 8 p.m., and Sunday, noon to 6 p.m.
